Who can submit a proposal?

College, graduate and PhD students are highly encouraged to submit a proposal in the fields of social sciences and humanities, arts and literature. According to the Fonds de recherche du Québec – Société et culture, the social sciences, humanities, arts and literature (SSHAL) include the following fields of research:

- Arts, Literature and Society;
- Writing and Fine Arts;
- · Cultures, Religions and Civilizations;
- The Development and Functioning of Individuals, Communities and Social Living;
- The Economy, Employment and Markets;
- · Education, Knowledge and Skills;
- Fundamental Issues and Meaning of Life;
- Organizational Management;
- Language and Languages;
- Media, Communication and Information;
- Living Environments, Planning and Appropriation of Human spaces;
- The Nature, Transformation and Governance of Society and Institutions;
- International Relations and Development.

Call for proposals for college students

The aim of the Colloque interordre de la recherche étudiante en sciences sociales et humaines is to allow college students interested in pursuing research in the fields of social sciences and humanities, arts and literature to present a poster, in French or in English.

Call for proposals for university students

Graduate and PhD students are invited to give an oral presentation, in French or in English, in the fields of social sciences and humanities, arts and literature.

Call for proposals for inter-level teams

Graduate and PhD students who are part of an inter-level team are invited to present either a poster or an oral presentation, in French or in English, in the fields of social sciences and humanities, arts and literature.

What criteria will be used to evaluate the proposals?

Here are some suggestions to help you produce a quality abstract. Use them to draw up your own proposal. First and foremost, your proposal must be based on original research. This is what the Evaluation Committees that review the poster proposals will be looking for. Moreover, the poster proposals selected by the committees will be published in various documents and, if they meet all criteria, may even be quoted.

Catchy title (maximum 180 characters, including spaces)

Full abstract (maximum 1,500 characters, including spaces)

Excellent writing

- Choose a short, specific, informative and clear title that encapsulates the poster topic.
- Be creative: Use wording that will pique the curiosity of the evaluation committees as well as attendees.
- Build your abstract in one paragraph, around the following four elements: a clear statement of the issue; a succinct description of the methodology; final or preliminary findings; and a conclusion.
- Avoid redundant wording such as: "This presentation shows that...."
- Use jargon-free language.
- When using abbreviations, first put the full expression, then the abbreviation.
- Use mathematical formulas or statistics only if they clarify your message.
- If you must include bibliographic references, make sure they're complete and conform to APA guidelines.

Why organize an inter-level colloquium on student research in this sector?

The main objective of the inter-level colloquium on research activities carried out by students in social sciences and humanities, arts and literature is to provide those students with the opportunity to participate in an event dedicated to scientific communication and knowledge transfer. More specifically, it aims to promote research in this sector, to encourage college students to pursue their studies in a field that interests them, to offer participants a venue for networking, to offer them an opportunity to experience a science day (sometimes for the first time), to promote discussion and contacts between college and university students, and, finally, to recognize and highlight the efforts they invest in their research activities.
